On January 21, 2022, leading global semiconductor manufacturer Intel Corporation announced that they'd chosen Ohio as the future home of their most advanced semiconductor manufacturing facilities in the world. Phase I of Intel's investment in Ohio represents a \$20 billion capital investment, 3,000 direct Intel jobs earning an average of \$135,000 per year (plus benefits), 7,000 construction jobs, tens of thousands of additional indirect and support jobs, and a seismic economic impact on Ohio and the Midwest. Ohio has been preparing for a win like this for decades – this panel will discuss why Intel chose Ohio, the collective efforts Ohio and the Midwest will undertake to help make Intel successful here, and how communities across the region can benefit directly from Intel, while preparing for a "Mega Project" of their own.
